

Food and Water Security

- Rejuvenation of a total 93 community water bodies in 7 blocks of 3 districts of Rajasthan
- Increase in water holding capacity by 9,25,698 cubic meters
- Water secure communities
- Contribute to mitigating drought and reducing migration of livestock and communities
- Provided 5 saplings for plantation to 200 families and 1500 saplings to school children & nutritional garden established





Education

- Leading 'Educate Girls' campaign for girls from poor backgrounds
- Successfully able to raise funds from the community for examination and tuition fees for over 300 students
- The aim of the campaign is to reach 1000 such needy girls





Health

- More than 100 awareness and training sessions were organized on WASH for adolescent girls and women
- 10000 eco-friendly reusable Sanitary Pads for Teen Girls and Women





Capacity Building

- Community-Based Organizations: More than 15 Joint Liability Groups (JLGs) and 55 Village Development Committees (VDCs) with over 150 women members, 50% of whom are women
- Skill-based training given to more than 100 rural urban slum women and girls on tailoring, designing etc.
- Teaching financial literacy to women of rural and urban settlements with the help of banks



- Women linked to the formal banking system
- Women got loans worth about 2.5 crore at low-interest rates



Relief Work

- Distribution of over 1000 ration kits during the COVID-19 pandemic to families in rural and urban areas of Jodhpur, Pali, and Nagore districts of Rajasthan
- Distribution of 15000 N-95 respiratory masks to frontline workers
- Assistance in COVID-19 vaccination campaign
- Distribution of 960 blankets to destitute families in winter
